



## ADORABLE FAN STITCH SCARF

IMPORTANT NOTE: Unless yarn specified is used, African Expressions cannot accept the responsibility for the finished work.

Owing to printing restrictions the colour reproduction is matched as closely to the yarn as possible.

Original garment worked in one size only.

Pattern and Design by Margret Botha.

**MATERIALS:** ADORE (100g balls) 2 Adore 100g balls

One pair of 7mm knitting needles

**MEASUREMENTS:** 

22cm wide and 1m long

TENSION: SAVE TIME, TAKE TIME, CHECK TENSION 18sts and 16rows = 10cm over stocking stitch pattern using 7mm needles. FOR BEST RESULTS IT IS ESSENTIAL TO OBTAIN THE CORRECT TENSION. IF THERE ARE TOO FEW STS ON TEST SWATCH, USE THINNER NEEDLES; IF THERE ARE TOO MANY STS, USE THICKER NEEDLES.

## ABBREVIATIONS:

K = Knit; k2tog = knit two stitches
together; P = Purl; patt(s) = pattern(s);
rem = remaining; rep = repeat; st(s) =
stitches; yf = yarn to front of needle.

## STITCHES USED:

**FAN PATTERN:** 

1st row: K 2nd row: P

**3rd row:** K2 \*(k2tog) 3 times; (yf,k1) 6 times; (k2tog) 3 times; rep from \* to end of row

4th row: K

Repeat these four rows

IMPORTANT NOTE: Always k the first and last st of every row to keep a firm straight edge. This stitch is called an edge stitch and is not included in the pattern.

Using 7mm needles cast on 40 sts.

Knit one row.

Repeat the pattern to desired length. Our scarf was 80 cm long at this point.


Button hole row: Made on 1st row of the pattern.

K to last 7 sts of the row, cast off 3sts, k to end of row.

**Next row:** P, cast on 3 sts over the cast off sts of previous row, p to end.

Complete pattern and work 1 more patter. Cast off knitwise on a 4th row.

Sew on button.
